NYPI is seeking an independent contractor to work with our Training Team to provide conflict resolution and restorative practices skills training to organizations and individuals under the supervision of NYPI's Director of Training & Conflict Consulting from October 2024 - September 2025.

The Independent Contractor (IC) will be paid at the hourly rate of \$65 - \$85 per hour, depending upon skills and experience. IC may work less than 10 hours or more than 40 hours, in any given month upon mutual agreement by both parties.

This Independent Contractor relationship may be extended by mutual agreement.

- At least 3-5 years of experience training and/or teaching others
- Ability to coordinate among various stakeholders to complete projects and activities
- Ability to work collaboratively and independently
- A demonstrated commitment to social change

• High level of cultural competency (the ability to communicate and interact with people across cultures who have varying beliefs)

Scope of Engagement and Deliverables

- Participate in training and observation of New York Peace Institute training sessions to better understand NYPI's curriculum, objectives, in order to lead and support these training sessions in the future.
- Provide conflict resolution training sessions to organizations and individuals in person or via zoom, as needed (with or without technical support from NYPI Staff). This includes preparing for the training, reviewing the training outline and concepts with NYPI Staff, communicating with the client about zoom/location set up and other technical issues, following up with the client with a performance survey, submitting invoice requests and supporting documentation to the Training Team for invoicing purposes, and participating in post and pre-training feedback/planning sessions.
- Provide de-escalation and conflict resolution training to NYPD law enforcement, in person
 or via Zoom. This includes preparing for the training, supporting NYPI staff members
 who are leading the training, leading the training with some support from the Training
 Associate and/or other NYPI Staff), maintaining and submitting supporting documentation
 (attendance sheets, evaluation forms, etc.) to the Training Associate at the completion of
 each training session.
- Participate in at least 1 roundtable at the request of New York Peace Institute.
